In a constantly changing world, it is important that Europe presents itself as a worthy geopolitical player. European cooperation is of great importance for exchanging knowledge, tackling domestic challenges, and solving cross-border problems, says Marcel Levi, chairman of the board of the Netherlands Organization for Scientific Research (NWO).



There will be European elections on June 6. Why is European cooperation important for the knowledge field?

"Europe's strategic autonomy is becoming increasingly important in current geopolitical relations. If we join forces and knowledge in Europe, we will be stronger in a turbulent, multipolar world. Dutch scientists work within Europe together with their international colleagues on cross-border social challenges. We can also learn from each other in policy areas such as open science, knowledge security and recognition & appreciation."

What results in recent years can the EU be most proud of in your opinion?

"The increased awareness that the EU plays a geopolitical role in a multipolar world. The EU's response to the Corona pandemic is also a good example of crisis management in an international context. In the field of science, for example, the ERC and European coordination around research infrastructure are of great added value."

How would Parliament and Commission really make a difference for knowledge institutions over the next five years?

"The European Framework Program for Research and Innovation creates joint European research agendas and is an important source of research funding for Dutch science. The European Parliament and the European Commission can establish an ambitious and future-oriented budget for research and innovation and then not tinker with it for five years."

How can we better link Dutch and European policy, bearing in mind the recent advice from the Education Council and AWTI?

"Sending a strong signal with the Dutch knowledge field what our wishes are for the new European Framework Program (FP10). Horizon Europe seems to be increasingly focusing on innovation and rapid (economic) impact. Make sure there is enough room for fundamental research. Basic research is essential because it forms the pipeline for new ideas and concepts that later find their way into applications. Ensure that the entire breadth of the knowledge chain is financed and that there is an adequate balance in financing independent and thematic research. Make inter- and transdisciplinarity central when tackling transitions, with attention to the role played by the social sciences and humanities."

ERC President Maria Leptin explains the background and rationale to the recent changes in the evaluation process of ERC grant proposals.





Research evaluation is at the heart of the ERC's work. Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions award €260 million to postdoctoral researchers in 2023 (13 February 2024)

1,249 experienced post-doctoral researchers were selected for funding among 8,039 applicants.



The European Commission will award €260 million to 1,249 post-doctoral researchers to work at top universities, research centres, private and public organisations and small and medium-sized enterprises.

The European Research Executive Agency https://rea.ec.europa.eu/funding-and-grants/horizon-europe-marie-sklodowska-curie-actions_en (REA) received 8,039 applications for this call, 15.8% of which were selected for funding. The Commission will award

- €221.40 million to 1,110 researchers through European Postdoctoral Fellowships, allowing them to carry out their projects in the EU or countries associated to Horizon Europe
- € 39.07 million for Global Postdoctoral Fellowships, allowing 139 researchers to carry out research outside the EU or countries associated to Horizon Europe, mostly in the United States, Switzerland, Canada and Japan, before returning back to Europe

Women are 42% of the awardees. Selected applicants represent nearly 80 nationalities and will work in 45 countries in Europe and the rest of the world.

The projects selected span all scientific disciplines

- social sciences and humanities (25.2%)
- life sciences (21.7%)
- information sciences and engineering (13.3%)
- chemistry (14.4%)
- physics (11.35%)
- environment and geosciences (10.2%)
- mathematics (2.15%)
- economic sciences (1.7%)

Among the successful applicants, three postdoctoral fellows have been selected in the field of nuclear research as part of the **cooperation between the MSCA and the Euratom Research and Training Programme 2021-2025** https://research-and-innovation.ec.europa.eu/funding/funding-opportunities/funding-programmes-and-open-calls/horizoneurope/euratom-research-and-training-programme_en.

Call open: 2 million euro available for second round Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership (29 February 2024)

The second joint transnational co-funded call of Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership (SBEP) is now open for pre-proposals. This partnership is about research contributing to the transition to a regenerative, resilient and sustainable economy at the European seas.

Within Europe almost 4.5 million inhabitants are dependent on the sea for their income. A sustainable use of the sea, and the different functions the seas offer is therefore vital. This partnership aims to stimulate the transformation to a climate neutral, sustainable, productive and competitive blue economy. It also aims to restore the health, resilience, and services of the ocean for humanity by enabling economic activities, which are climate neutral, sustainable and productive.

The Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership is a European cooperation of 26 countries. In this partnership, several transnational calls are planned. The second call aims to support transnational research and innovation and is focused on four priority-areas:

- 1. Digital Twins of the Ocean (DTO) at regional sub-basin scale
- 2. Blue economy sectors, development of marine multi-use infrastructures
- 3. Planning and managing sea-uses at the regional level
- 4. Blue bioresources.

Deadline for submitting a pre-proposal (mandatory) is April 10th, 2024 at 15:00 CEST. Deadline for submitting a full proposal is November 6th, 2024 at 15:00 CET.

The call invites researchers to submit research proposals in transnational collaboration, preferably in collaboration with relevant stakeholders from industry, government, and civil society organisations. Consortia must be formed with partners of at least two participating countries. For the Dutch participation, researchers from TO2 organisations and Universities of Applied Sciences are also allowed to join. Commission invests more than €233 million in strategic environmental and climate projects (29 February 2024)

The European Commission is investing more than €233 million in twelve new strategic projects under the LIFE programme. The projects aim to help ten Member States achieve their national environmental and climate targets and increase their contribution to the EU's green transition. This includes projects on reducing fossil fuels in industrial processes and sustainable urban mobility. "We need to significantly accelerate adaptation to climate change. Improving our natural carbon sinks, decarbonizing industries and transport and increasing our climate resilience will be important parts of the solution," said European Commissioner Hoekstra. The call for Senior Experts of the NL-CGIAR Senior Expert Programme II is now open. This call supports the participation of Dutch research organisations in CGIAR with the aim of advancing knowledge, knowledge use, and enhancing innovation for global food and nutrition security through cooperation between the Netherlands and CGIAR, the largest global research partnership for a food-secure future.

Aim of the call

The overall goal of the SEP is advancing knowledge and enhancing innovation (knowledge use) for global food and nutrition security (SDG2) through cooperation between the Netherlands and CGIAR. The objectives are:

- Leveraging Dutch knowledge and expertise for performance and impact of CGIAR Research Initiatives;
- Leveraging CGIAR expertise, science and networks for Dutch knowledge institutions;
- Partnering in research and innovation, cooperation in knowledge sharing and capacity strengthening in a number of selected areas of mutual interest of CGIAR and Dutch policy on global food and nutrition security.

Three Dutch awards in European programme sustainable use of the European seas (19 February 2024)

In the first joint transnational co-funded call of Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership (SBEP) three projects with Dutch participation have been funded. These projects will receive a total of 874,000 euros from NWO. The Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership aims to boost the transition to a sustainable use of the European seas and a productive and competitive Blue Economy. Research is needed that can help aligning the economic and ecologic interests of the sea. Enabling us to use the resources the sea offers without harming nature. Research in this field can also help create and maintain green jobs on and around the sea.

Within the Sustainable Blue Economy Partnership several calls for proposals will be published, this was the first transnational call. This call aims to answer questions on more sustainable and smart marine and maritime innovations. Within this transnational call nineteen projects are awarded funding, of which three projects have a Dutch contribution. The awarded projects with a Dutch contribution in this programme are part of three intervention-areas: planning and management of sea uses, sustainable and resources-efficient Blue food and Feed, and Digital Twin of the Ocean: the creation of a detailed digital model of the seas on a sub-basin scale.

Two of the three awarded projects with Dutch contribution do have WUR applicants Aquafeed Upgraded: Enhancing Immune Function with Seaweed-modified Functional Compounds (AquaUp): Main Dutch applicant: Dr Fotini Kokou (Wageningen University & Research centre)

Digital Twin of the Ocean: Animal Tracking (DTO-Track): Main Dutch applicant: Dr Ir. Leo Nagelkerke (Wageningen University & Research centre)

The Joint Programming Initiative on Antimicrobial Resistance (JPIAMR) launched the 'AMR Diagnostics and Surveillance 2023' grant call in January 2023. This is the 16th call within the JPIAMR involving 23 financiers from 19 countries. 17 projects were found to be honorable, of which 5 projects have Dutch involvement. Develop new and improve existing ones

To take action against the growing global threat of increasing resistance in pathogenic microorganisms, and the spread of antimicrobial resistance (AMR), the above-mentioned call for grants has been launched. The aim of the call is to fund research projects that improve or new develop existing strategies, instruments, technologies and methods for diagnostics and/or One Health AMR surveillance. In addition to antibiotics, this call also focuses on antifungal agents and biocides.

Vici grants for research on ethical AI, black holes and more (29 February 2024)

Research on topics ranging from ethical AI to the long-term effects of childhood cancer treatment. Thirty-five scientists from the Science (ENW), Applied and Engineering Sciences (AES), Social Sciences and Humanities (SSH) and Health Research and Development (ZonMw) domains will receive Vici grants worth up to 1.5 million euros. This will enable the laureates to develop an innovative line of research and set up their own research group for five years.

Vici is one of the largest scientific grants for individuals in the Netherlands and targets advanced researchers. The funding instrument enables researchers to pursue research of their own choice. This gives innovative research a boost and encourages the promotion of talent at scientific research institutes. Scientists carry out research on a variety of topics. These range from exploring the origins of black holes to measuring the health of our ecosystems.

Facts and figures

Vici grants are awarded annually by NWO. There were 337 preproposals and 110 full proposals. Of the 110 full proposals, 48 (44%) were submitted by women and 62 (56%) by men. Overall, 35 Vici grants were awarded; 20 to women and 15 to men. The award percentages for the Vici Round 2023 are thus 14% for women and 8% for men respectively.

Six research projects to start through Open Technology Programme (27 February 2024)

Six research projects can start with funding through the Open Technology Programme from the NWO Domain Applied and Engineering Sciences. NWO is contributing over 5.1 million euros to these application-oriented technical-scientific projects. Industry and other organisations add almost 1.4 million euros to this.

The awarded projects within the Open Technology Programme will conduct research including:

- Improving the sensitivity of image sensors in the short-wavelength infrared region. Image sensors, as now
 present in every smartphone, could then be used for tasks such as night vision (project: SWIRIS).
- Maximising treatment speed and quality for cancer care patients via hybrid magnetic resonance/radiotherapy systems. These systems enable personalised treatment based on the patient's current anatomy (project: ART-PIVOT).
- Develop and implement algorithms that can identify noise-producing events, and automatically assess their quality. With this information, nurses can understand and improve the footprint of sounds, which is beneficial in a critical care environment with a lot of noise, such as a paediatric ICU (project: Auditory Footprints).

Positive evaluation of Implementation Plan Digital Research Infrastructure (21 February 2024)

NWO welcomes the positive evaluation of the Implementation Plan Investments in Digital Research Infrastructure. There is no need to revise the Implementation Plan. NWO will work on the different recommendations.

In 2018, the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science (OCW) asked NWO for advice on the increasing digitalisation of science and the needs for digital infrastructure and expertise. In response, the then ICT Subcommittee of the Permanent Committee on Large-Scale Scientific Infrastructure (PC-GWI) provided advice to NWO in the spring of 2019. The planned investments from the PC-GWI advice were then specified in the **Implementation Plan Investments Digital Research Infrastructure**

https://www.nwo.nl/sites/nwo/files/documents/Uitvoeringsplan%20investeringen%20digitale%20onderzoeksinfrastructuur .pdf. The Implementation Plan stipulated that NWO would evaluate the extent to which the additional investments had

achieved the desired effect by the end of 2022. This evaluation has now been carried out by Dialogic, an independent research and consultancy company. The evaluation covers the years 2020-2022.

Conclusions of the evaluation report

Dialogic's evaluation report concludes that the collaboration between NWO, SURF and the eScience Centre went smoothly, despite the turbulent period during which the Implementation Plan was developed (the reorganisation of SURF and the eScience Centre and the COVID-19 crisis), which delayed some parts of the Implementation Plan. The evaluation report also concludes that the Implementation Plan's investments in high-performance computing (HPC), other computing facilities and data storage are adequate and are perceived as positive.

The Fund invests, among other things, in sustainable research, development and innovation projects. The Nederlandse Organisatie voor

Wetenschappelijk Onderzoek (NWO - Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research) is involved in several projects as organiser for NGF research funding programmes.

The Future-Proof Hightech Equipment call is part of the NXTGEN HIGHTECH programme of NGF. The NXTGEN HIGHTECH programme is dedicated to creating a new generation of technology that will be important for future generations, and aims to develop, deploy and apply new knowledge across six promising high-tech domains:

- 1. Laser satcom.
- 2. Energy conversion and storage.
- 3. Biomedical production technology.
- 4. Semicon equipment for heterogeneous integration.
- 5. Flexible micro-factories for composites.
- 6. Hands-free agrifood.

The aim of the Future-Proof Hightech Equipment call is to increase academic and practice-based research for a number of prioritised key and systems technologies over the course of the NXTGEN HIGHTECH programme, in order to fast-track development of high-tech equipment targeting sustainability, digitisation, healthcare and technological sovereignty. The proposed research must link at least one prioritised key technology with one of the systems technologies. The following key technologies dedicated to strengthening the technology ecosystem in the Netherlands for the next generation of high-tech equipment are prioritised under this call:

- Cyber-physical systems/Robotics.
- Mechatronics/Optomechatronics.
- Semiconductors/Lithographic systems.
- Thin film/Plasma technology.
- Bionanotechnology.

The following two systems technologies are central to all six application domains within NXTGEN HIGHTECH:

- Smart industry
- Systems engineering.

In the Earning Capacity committee debate with the House of Representatives on February 15, 2024, Minister Adriaansens proposed postponing the planning of the fourth round of the National Growth Fund by two months to provide room for the questions about the National Growth Fund that will be asked in the Second and First Room life. This means that the intended date for opening the submission of the subsidy scheme will be postponed from April 1 to June 1, 2024.

According to this new planning, the mandatory pre-registration would be opened on April 1, 2024. The mandatory pre-registration precedes the submission of the proposal and applies to both the subsidy route and the departmental route.

Ministers Adriaansens has promised not to take any irreversible steps before the opening of the fourth round on June 1. It is important for potential applicants to take this into account. The consultation with the Senate is scheduled for February 27, 2024. We will provide an update on the state of affairs after this debate.

Report of the High-Level Group on the Future of Cohesion Policy



Today, the independent Group of High-Level Specialists on the Future of Cohesion Policy presented its report, which assessed the functioning of Cohesion Policy and included recommendations on how to ensure the Policy continues to promote prosperity and convergence across the EU. These recommendations will add to the ongoing reflections and body of opinions from many stakeholders and institutions on the future of Cohesion Policy.

Set up by Commissioner for Cohesion and Reforms Elisa **Ferreira**, the Group - which is independent from the Commission - looked at ways to ensure that Cohesion Policy continues to support growth and recovery across Europe's regions, all the while delivering on the green and digital transition and helping regions adjust to ongoing demographic, industrial, and geopolitical challenges.

The Report is the outcome of intense work carried out by the Group throughout this past year, enriched by academic contributions, input papers prepared by the Commission, and presentations by different stakeholders.

The Report is structured around three key questions to reflect on the future of Cohesion Policy beyond 2027:

- Why is Cohesion Policy crucial for the future of Europe?
- What does Cohesion Policy do, and what should it do?
- *How* can Cohesion Policy *better fulfil* its mission of economic, social, and territorial cohesion in the context of the green and digital transition and demographic change?

The Group makes the following recommendations. Cohesion Policy should:

- be more **place-based**, with future-oriented investments tailored to the unique strengths, challenges, and needs of each region;
- promote a holistic approach for social policy by investing more in human capital development and social integration to prevent and reduce inequalities in all territories;
- **utilise local capabilities and potential** to develop future opportunities for inclusive and sustainable growth through diversification and collaboration;
- **build better national and regional institutions** by putting capacity-building and innovation on par with investment in infrastructure as well as productive capital;
- deliver more effective and inclusive development strategies by using the principles of strong partnership and shared management, bringing together stakeholders from different levels of government and civil society;
- connect regions to harness global opportunities and to deliver more sustainable and resilient innovation;
- become more performance-based, blending this approach with its territorial dimension;
- be better embedded in the economic governance system;

- **streamline its administrative procedures** and adopt more efficient, user-friendly approaches to simplify processes; and
- remain focused on its original mission of driving sustainable development and boosting competitiveness, while maintaining flexibility to address urgent challenges.



EU unveils plans for €500M partnership on advanced materials (29 February 2024)

The public-private partnership will support research and development of advanced materials, which the Commission says are crucial to the EU's competitiveness



The European Commission wants to launch a €500 million public-private partnership on advanced materials, as part of plans to boost Europe's standing in the sector published on Tuesday.

The EU would commit €250 million to the partnership between 2025 and 2027 to attract matching private investment and allow companies to scale and accelerate the deployment of advanced materials.

"The EU's competitiveness relies on our technological edge and steady supply of advanced materials for our green and digital transitions," said Margrethe Vestager, executive vice president of the European Commission.

The plans relate to engineered materials with novel properties, such as metallic nanoparticles to enhance energy conversion in solar panels, and sodium-ion batteries which provide more sustainable energy storage. Advanced materials underpin innovation in clean energy technologies, semiconductors, and pharmaceuticals, and have potential applications in space and defence.

They could also be alternatives to certain critical raw materials, reducing the EU's dependence on third countries. The Commission is planning to identify research and innovation needs in this area and to publish the first results early next year.

In addition to the ministers of EU Member States, there were ministers of the EU's most important partner countries and representatives of interest groups such as the OECD, UNESCO and International Science Council.

Seven member states are allowed to grant almost 7 billion euros in state aid to hydrogen projects (29 February 2024)

The European Commission has approved seven member states, including the Netherlands, to award a total of 6.9 billion euros in state aid to hydrogen projects under the IPCEI Hy2Infra. France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal and Slovakia are involved in the projects. Public investments are expected to generate another 5.4 billion euros in private investments. Hy2Infra focuses, among other things, on the rollout of large-scale

electrolysis installations and the development of large-scale installations for hydrogen storage. "The supply chain for renewable hydrogen in Europe is still in its infancy, but Hy2Infra creates the first building blocks of an integrated and open renewable hydrogen network," said European Commissioner Vestager. "This IPCEI will set up the first regional infrastructure clusters in a number of Member States and pave the way for interconnections across Europe, in line with the European hydrogen strategy. This will enable the market supply of renewable hydrogen in Europe to be scaled up and create a Europe that is the first in 2050 continent is climate neutral, one step closer."

German science minister calls for a rethink of "strong wall" between civilian and military research (20 February 2024)

At the Munich Security Conference, Bettina Stark-Watzinger made the case that research is now at the centre of geopolitical rivalry. But changing the German research system remains difficult

Germany's science minister has called for a rethink of the country's traditional separation between civilian and military research during an unprecedented debate on research security at the Munich Security Conference.

More normally the haunt of generals than science ministers, Bettina Stark-Watzinger's appearance at the conference is a mark of how dramatically security concerns, particularly around China, are now part of science and innovation policy. "It is a strong signal, that research is a geopolitical factor," said Stark-Watzinger during a panel debate https://securityconference.org/msc-2023/agenda/event/conversation-on-research-security-knowledge-first-securitysecond/ on 16 February.

Back in 2016, the then EU research Commissioner Carlos Moedas was trumpeting the EU's Horizon 2020 research programme as "open to the world."

Fast forward to 2024, and following the pandemic, war in Ukraine, and European nervousness over China's designs on Taiwan, the slogan has changed to, "As open as possible, as closed as necessary," as Stark-Watzinger put it. For her, the pandemic was the key turning point that demonstrated the risk of technological dependence, and the need to be less naïve about research cooperation.

In 2020, Europe was initially heavily dependent on China for supplies of personal protective equipment, and Brussels then had to fight for a supply of vaccines from multinational pharmaceutical companies. "If you have technology, and others depend heavily on that, you have power. So the tech race is in full swing, and we have to be part of that," she said.

Joint push by Ivanova and EU research ministers for 'stable' budget (16 February 2024)

At an informal meeting in Belgium, EU research ministers and research commissioner Iliana Ivanova agreed on the need to safeguard research funding, after €2.1 billion was cut from Horizon Europe

European research and innovation ministers and Commissioner Iliana Ivanova have affirmed a joint commitment to safeguard the budget of the next framework programme for research, in the face of growing pressure from national governments to divert EU funds towards other priorities. Research ministers from EU member states, as well as the UK, Norway, Iceland and Switzerland, gathered in La Hulpe, Belgium, on Thursday 15 February for the first informal competitiveness council under the Belgian Presidency of the Council.

"We discussed how important it is to have a stable budget for the framework programme," said Willy Borsus, Vice-President of the Government of Wallonia, during a press conference following the meeting. "Research cannot be considered one of the most fundamental levers for action, deployment, and also for the future of the European Union, if the budget for the framework programme is under pressure or mishandled," he said. The current framework programme, Horizon Europe, had its budget cut by €2.1 billion earlier this week, as member states agreed on a revision to the EU's long-term budget that allowed the bloc to unlock financial aid for war-torn Ukraine.

Research delegations underlined the importance of "predictability" for stakeholders to plan for future participation in the research programme, as well as the "flexibility to respond to increasingly rapid developments and emerging needs". Despite the ministers' statements, the political odds are weighted against them at the moment, analysts say. The budget pressures on the EU are intense, and finance ministers are seldom sympathetic to research lobbies in the best of times. In the end, some MEPs say, the final decision will come down to the prime ministers and chancelors, rather than research or finance ministers, when budget deals get cut in top-level Council meetings in the months ahead. Ministers were meeting to prepare for a formal Council meeting on 23 May, where they could restate their concerns about the research budget, Borsus said.

"Unfortunately, the finance ministers are not part of our meeting, but I think the results of research are the best Ivanova, who was also present for the meeting, said she was pleased to have reached a deal to fund emergencies such as aid to Ukraine, but was "not happy" about the ≤ 2.1 billion cuts to Horizon Europe.

Today, the Belgian Presidency of the Council of the European Union hosted an international conference which endorsed the Ministerial Statement on principles and values for international cooperation in research & innovation ('Brussels Statement').

The Statement, crafted collectively by the participating countries, stakeholder organisations, the Presidency and the European Commission promotes continuous collaboration, recognising that diversity fosters trust among global partners, and emphasises the importance of international collaboration in research and innovation in addressing global challenges and advancing knowledge.

The Brussels Statement calls for a roadmap to establish a common understanding of principles and values for international R&I cooperation, coordination with organisations such as UNESCO, UNCSTD, OECD, International Science Council, G7, G20, Council of Europe, and other international fora.

The Multilateral Dialogue on principles and values for international cooperation in research & innovation (R&I) was launched in July 2022, following the **European Commission's Communication on the Global Approach to R&I** https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/?uri=COM%3A2021%3A252%3AFIN which gained strong support by the EU Member States through **Council Conclusions in 2022** https://www.consilium.europa.eu/media/56956/st10125-en22.pdf.



Large-scale international research shows high trust in scientists (29 February 2024)

People around the world have a high level of trust in scientists, and most want researchers to become more involved in policymaking. This is evident from a global study with more than 70,000 participants that was published online as a preprint last month. Nature has written about this. Confidence levels would differ from country to country and would be influenced by political orientation. "The overall message is positive," says researcher James Liu. "Even in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, which could have been very polarizing for people's trust in scientists, trust is quite high across a wide range of demographics."
